CALL FOR PAPERS

Dear Colleagues,

We invite you to take part in **the 2nd International Scientific Conference 'Slavic Studies'**, devoted to the 150th anniversary of founding of Todor Minkov Southern Slavic Boarding School. The questions of the history of formation and development of South Slavic Boarding School will be considered, and different aspects of teaching the Balkan youth on the territory of Ukraine in the 2nd half of the 19th century will be explored. Also, a traditional extensive discussion of problems of functioning and development of Slavic Languages and Literatures in the European and global context will take place.

The main objectives of the conference are to strengthen the deep connections among the Slavic languages and cultures of different countries, understanding their place in the context of different Slavic cultures, the intensification of philological research into Slavic languages, by expanding cooperation with experts from different countries.

The conference will take place on **April 21 – 22, 2017**, at the Department of Ukrainian Philology, Theory and History of Literature of Petro Mohyla Black Sea National University.

Also the conference will include roundtable discussions **'The Role of Todor Minkov Southern Slavic Boarding School in the Training of National Élites for the Balkan countries'**.

Conference scientific issues

Section 'Linguistics'

1. Classification of approaches to the philosophy of the Slavic languages.
2. Dynamic processes in the Slavic lexical systems.
3. The phraseology in the Slavic cultural ethnic space.
4. Theoretical issues in categorical grammar of Slavic languages.
5. Slavic languages in an religious discourse.
6. Slavic languages in historical typological and contrastive aspects.
7. Modern text theories in Slavic linguistics.

Section 'Literary Studies'

1. Slavic literature: history and modernity.
2. Slavic literature in a creative context.
3. Slavic literature in the pan-European / global context.
4. Slavic mythology and folklore in the artistic discourse.
5. Myths of the world's religions, traditional images and plots in Slavic literatures.
6. Poetics of Slavic literatures.
7. Slavic cultural traditions in the age of globalization and ethnicization.

Section 'History of Slavs'

1. History of the South Slavs.
2. History of West Slav peoples.
3. East Slavs in the context of regional studies.
4. History of the Slavic countries in literary works.
5. Ethnological issues of the history of Slavs.
6. Slavic peoples in the history of Mykolayiv region.
7. Slavdom in modern global political processes.

Conference languages: Slavic languages and English.

Participation form: full-time and part-time.

Travel and accommodation fees are covered by participants themselves.

Registration fee (which includes the cost of the conference program publishing, technical and information support of the event, as well as food) for participants from Ukraine (full-time) – **200 UAH**, for foreign participants – **10 Euros**.

The deadline for applications is **April 10, 2017**.

MATERIALS PUBLICATION

The articles that are prepared on the basis on reports will be published in professional Petro Mohyla Black Sea National University journals: *'Scientific Works: Scientific and Methodological Journal. – Philology. Linguistics'* (under the resolution of the Presidium of HAC of Ukraine, this journal was included into the list of 528 scientific professional journals in philological subjects in which the results of dissertations can be published), *'Scientific Works: Scientific and Methodological Journal. – Philology. Literature Studies'* (the journal was approved as a professional journal by the resolution of the Presidium of HAC on May 12 2015 № 528), *'Scientific Works: Scientific and Methodological Journal. – History'* (the journal was approved as a professional journal by the resolution of the Presidium of HAC on December 21 2015 № 1328) and *'Black Sea Chronicle'* (the journal was approved as a professional journal by the resolution of the Presidium of HAC on May 31 2011 № 1-05/5).

- an electronic version of your article the volume of which should be 8 – 12 pages;
- a photo of the payment receipt;
- an application (application form is attached).

Publication Fee. For participants from Ukraine, the publication fee is **380 UAH**.

For foreign participants, the publication fee is **20 Euros**.

Articles written by doctors of science are published free of charge.

ARTICLE SUBMISSION SPECIFICATIONS AND GUIDELINES

You may submit an article in Ukrainian, Russian or English. An article should correspond to the subject area of journals and to the requirements of the Presidium of HAC resolution № 7-05/1 on the 15.01.2003.

The main body of the article should correspond to the following structure:

- 1. Problem presentation** in its general overview and its connection with important scientific or practical tasks.
- 2. Analysis of recent research and publication**, identifying previously unsolved parts of the general problem to which the article is devoted.
- 3. Formulating the objectives of the article** (tasks presentation).
- 4. Presentation of the main material** of the research with sufficient justification of research results.
- 5. Conclusions** of the research and the prospects of future investigation in the field.

Articles should be submitted electronically, typed in the word processor *Microsoft Word* and should have *.doc extension (the title of the file should be the surname of the first author transliterated in Latin). Articles should be typed in *Times New Roman* font, 1.5 line-to-line spacing; 1.25 cm with paragraph indent and 2 cm margins. Diagrams and graphics should be created with the help of built-in Microsoft Word tools; references in the text are compulsory.

An article should contain such structural elements (in Ukrainian):

- UDC (Universal Decimal Classification) index, left alignment;
- author's (authors') surname and initials, scientific degree, academic rank, job (place of employment), city, country, email address (right alignment);
- title of the article (capital letters in bold, central alignment);
- abstracts in Ukrainian, Russian and English. The abstracts in Ukrainian and Russian should be about 100-150 words (description of the main topic, problem, objectives, summarized results). The abstract in English should be 200-250 words written in one paragraph that does not copy a short abstract submitted in Ukrainian. The abstract is submitted corresponding to *SCOPUS* requirements as a structured summary and must include such elements as: subject, topic, aims of the work, research methods, scientific novelty, field of result application, conclusions;
- keywords in Ukrainian, Russian and English (5-8 words separated by semicolons);
- main body of the article;
- references;
- additional information provided at the end in English and Russian: surname, name, patronymic of the author (authors), job (place of employment), city, country; article title;
- application in Ukrainian added to the article as a separate file in which such information should be indicated about each author separately: surname, name, patronymic in full, scientific degree, academic rank, position, email address of each author, contact telephone number, field of scientific interests. If available, *ORCID* identifier should be indicated.

Post-graduate students and degree-seekers must provide a review by a doctor of science in the publication field (or its scanned version).

Editorial board has a right to edit and review the article.
